The 2016 elections and the positions taken by candidates during the campaign will be bellwethers of the Washington conditions that the industry will face over the next two years and beyond.

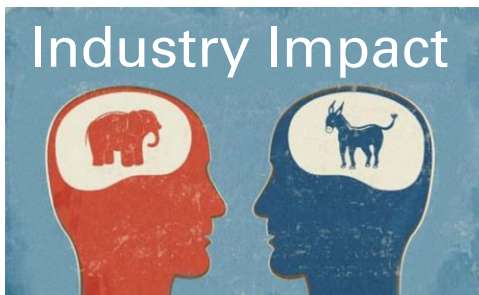
